THE SEASON OF ADVENT

Advent often focus on preparation for the birth of Jesus, and on themes of hope, peace, joy, and love. The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." The message of Advent, therefore, is "Prepare the way for the Lord. Get ready. The Lord is coming." It is not as strict as Lent, and there are no rules for fasting, but it is meant to be a period of

self-preparation. The purple colour associated with Advent is also the colour of penance. An ideal preparation for welcoming the Lord is to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

May this Advent be a time of spiritual awakening and renewal for you as you prepare to celebrate the birth of the Saviour of the World.

The Catholic bishops of England and Wales have expressed dismay after a historic vote yesterday, Nov. 29, during which Members of Parliament (MPs) voted in favour of assisted suicide. Following a five-hour, Second Reading debate in the House of Commons, 330 MPs voted in favor of the TERMINALLY ILL ADULTS (END OF LIFE) Bill, while 275 voted against it.....
