MASS IN ST FERGUS & ST PETER'S THIS WEEK: No mass in St Fergus on Monday 18th and Wednesday 20th morning as 40 hours adoration will be going on in St Peter's. Mass will be celebrated in St Peter's from Monday 18th to Thursday 21st at 10am in the Church.

<u>YOU SHALL BE MY WITNESSES</u>: The third and final catechesis programme for the primary 7 children of St Peter's School who will be receiving Confirmation within the next year is this Sunday (17th November) during our 10am Mass. The children will receive a catechesis during the Mass. While for Primary 7 children of St Fergus it will be on Wednesday 20th at 1.45pm in the Church.

ST PETER'S 40 HOURS: Our 40 hours Eucharistic Devotion begins on 18th November (Monday 18th Thursday 21st). We need at least one person/two persons for every hourly slot. The devotion begins at 9am and ends at 7pm every day. This may enable those who for work to spend some time in prayer after their return from work. A sign-up sheet is available at the back of the Church and at the side door of the Church. Please be generous with your time to encourage and spread this devotion. St Peter's School will join us.

NOT DEAD YET UK: A bill has been introduced to Parliament to legalise assisted suicide. This will be voted on by MPs on 29th November. We know that assisted suicide laws in other jurisdictions have had devastating consequences for the poor, disabled and marginalised. This is the biggest threat to the vulnerable and we need a huge effort to lobby MPs to vote against the bill. Postcards from the disability campaign group Not Dead Yet UK, a network of people who have disabilities who oppose assisted suicide, are available at the back of the church. Please sign and sent to your MPs to encourage them to vote against assisted suicide. Our MPs are telling us this is the biggest item in their postbags at present with a small majority asking them to oppose the Bill. Please keep up the pressure. Every card helps.

Public Demonstration Against Assisted Suicide. Glasgow, Friday 22 November, 6.00-9.00pm: You are encouraged to attend a Public Demonstration Against Assisted Suicide in Glasgow at 6.00-9.00pm on Friday 22 November. The event, organised by an Alliance of Concern and supported by the Campaign Against Assisted Dying, will hear civic concerns around the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill, which will be voted on by MPs in the UK Parliament on Friday 29 November. All MPs and MSPs in the Central Belt have been invited to attend. This event is supported by our Scottish Bishops' Parliamentary Office and Marriage, Family and Life Office. Bishops' Statement on Fossil Fuel Non-proliferation and Just Transition: The Bishops' Conference of Scotland (BCOS) have released a statement encouraging world leaders to agree to and establish a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty, committing all nations to a rapid and just transition away from fossil fuels. The statement, which is released to mark the COP29 climate summit taking place in Azerbaijain from 11th – 22nd November, calls on Scotland to play its role in realising the common good by participating in a swift transition away from fossil fuels to protect people and our planet, both now and in the future, from further global warming caused by fossil fuel extraction. Crucially, in recognising the workers and communities in Scotland who rely on fossil fuel industries for their livelihood, the statement emphasises that any such transition must have justice at its core and ensure that no one is left behind, particularly those currently employed in this sector who must be ensured secure work in the move towards renewables. The full text of the statement can be read on the BCOS, Justice & Peace Scotland, and Office for the Care of Creation websites.
