Today we reflect on the Christmas Crib

In the first place I extend my warmest Christmas wishes to you and your loved ones.

After four weeks of waiting and preparation, finally the day has come for us to rejoice and celebrate. In our fast-changing world, the mystery of Christmas challenges us to welcome Jesus the new-born, into the manger of our own inmost souls. Jesus, the Son of God, the Emmanuel, the Prince of Peace is here with us today and forever and expresses the desire to come into our lives. Jesus says, "He who welcomes me welcomes him who sent me (Mt 10:40)." And so, hope, peace, joy and love are born again among us. Each one of us is challenged to ask, 'What does the Christmas message mean to me personally today.' The answer is found in the manger. It was in 1223, St Francis of Assisi created history's first nativity scene in Greccio, a small village in Italy. He wanted to bring to life the memory of that babe born in Bethlehem in order that ordinary people could understand the story of the birth of Jesus. He set up a stable scene with real people and animals.

It was a tradition in the past that every family had a crib at home. It was made by parents with the help of children as they had shown great interest in having one at home. This tradition, however, has gradually disappeared over the years. But it is possible for us to bring back this glorious tradition to encourage our younger generation to instil hope and faith in them. What do we see in the manger? It is not only a little babe surrounded by his parents and animals but also, we all know from our experience and faith that this little babe is the most powerful God in history – the God sent Son into our midst. Today as you participate in the mass, please visit the crib with your family and say a small prayer of gratitude to God and ask the little babe to bless you and your dear ones. When we look at the manger the first feeling should be one of joy. It is evident in the words of the angel, "I am here to give you good news, great joy for all people. Today a Saviour has been born to you in David's town; he is the Messiah and the Lord" (Lk 2:10-11). So, Jesus' birth is a simple and joyful proclamation of the mystery of the Incarnation of the Son of God. So, he has come to encounter each of us in our daily lives. It is scripture based because we read in St Luke's Gospel (2:7) 'Mary gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.' When we come together for the Christmas mass we notice the altar has been beautifully decorated and a gorgeous crib set at a prominent place in the Church. As we celebrate the Christmas Mass we experience an indescribable joy in the presence of this new born because there is a bond between the incarnation of the Son of God and the Eucharist. From the words of the angel that, "I am here to give you good news, great joy for all people" it is clear that the crib is a means of evangelization; we all need to share this

good news with others. When we share it, our joy is doubled. This in turn will strengthen our faith. The crib is also a sign of God's love: we read in John's Gospel 3:16, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son...." Here in the crib we find the Creator of the universe humbled himself to take up our human nature. It encourages to follow him along the path of humility, poverty, self-denial and to take up our daily crosses in faith. It challenges us to meet him and serve him by showing mercy to those of our brothers and sisters in greatest need. The two great characters of the nativity scene are Joseph and Mary. Their obedience, humility and trust in God encourage us to have devotion to them and put God's words into practice.

WORDS OF GRATITUDE: Dear brothers and sisters we have come almost to the end of the year 2024. I sincerely thank each of you for all your help and all what you have been to this parish. It is possible to have a parish when its members participate in the liturgical celebrations and extend their cooperation to all the activities of the parish life. All of us as a parish have tried to meet some of our goals and we did achieve some, however, there are some areas we still need to work together for betterment.
