MASS OF COMMITMENT AND FAMILY MASS FOR ST PETER'S SCHOOL: Today, the 8th December (second Sunday of Advent) at 10.00am, we celebrate the mass of commitment for Primary 4 children of St Peter's Primary School. It is done in preparation for the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Also, it the family mass for Primary 4 & 7 children. The parents/guardians are expected to attend this mass. Primary 4 will have the usual 'Do this in Memory of Me' catechesis programme during Lent. MASS OF COMMITMENT IN ST FERGUS SCHOOL: On Monday 9th December, at 9:30am. St Fergus School will have the Mass of Enrolment /Commitment for all those children in Primary 3, who will receive their Sacraments in March and April of 2026, Primary 4, who will receive their Sacraments in March and April of 2025 and Primary 7 who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in May, in the school. It is important that families are represented at this Mass just as they were at their child's baptism. There will be tea and coffee with your children after Mass. Parishioners are welcome. Primary 4 will have the usual 'Do this in Memory of Me' catechesis programme during Lent.

THE SEASON OF ADVENT: The theme for the second Sunday of Advent is peace. On this day we light the second candle, called the Bethlehem Candle, candle of peace that Christ brought to mankind with His birth and incarnation. Also, it reflects on the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem. This is a time of coming together, of building a community of faith that is open to all. Every year on the second Sunday of Advent, the Church has us ponder the words and deeds of Saint John the Baptist, who prepared the way for the coming of the Lord. Advent is a season in the Church's life intended to renew the experience of waiting and longing for the Messiah. Though Christ has already come into the world, the Church invites us to renew our desire for the Lord more deeply in our lives and to renew our desire for Christ's triumphant second coming into the world.

Advent often focus on preparation for the birth of Jesus, and on themes of hope, peace, joy, and love. It is a period of self-preparation. The purple colour associated with Advent is also the colour of penance. An ideal preparation for welcoming the Lord is to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

May this Advent be a time of spiritual awakening and renewal for you as you prepare to celebrate the birth of the Saviour of the World.

THE SOLEMNITY OF IMMACULATE CONCEPTION: This year the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is celebrated on Monday the 9th December. In teaching that Mary was conceived immaculate, the Catholic Church teaches that from the very moment of her conception, the Blessed Virgin Mary was free from all stain of original sin. This simply means that from the beginning, she was in a state of grace, sharing in God's own life, and that she was free from the sinful inclinations which have beset human nature after the fall.

"Our Lady has always been present in the life of Jesus, from the manger to Calvary. So, she is always present in the life of the Church, from its beginning to its end. This faithfulness of hers gives us hope, this presence of hers is a guarantee of victory. It impels us to believe that his faithfulness is stronger than our infidelities, and in this faithfulness the Church can always find herself faithful to Jesus Christ. Inside the storms of modern times; in the midst of the icy winds of secularism, modernism, and relativism; under the threats of apostasy and idolatry, the Church remaining with Mary will triumph, will triumph because like Mary and with Mary, it is faithful to Christ to the end" (The story behind the Immaculate Conception banner at every Vatican Angelus in Catholic News Agency).
