

donations are welcome towards the cost of Church repairs starting in the first week of March. The collection box is placed inside the church as you enter and at side door. The recent notification from the Diocese says that it is mandatory every flat roof is inspected at least every 3 years and gutters cleared bi-annually. Records of all roof and gutter inspections and repairs should be retained and made available to insurers if requested in the event of a claim. Claims for any property damage caused by the poor condition of a roof or by blocked gutters will be declined. So, once this work has been completed we will ask the same company to inspect and do the necessary repairs of various parts of flat roofs that need immediate attention. I would also like to bring to your attention that at some places on the roofs of the church and chapel house the roofing felts have been blown away by the recent storm causing water leakage.

DAFFODIL TEA: As part of activities for the Jubilee Year, St Peter's children's liturgy would like to invite all elders in the parish to a Daffodil tea on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> March from 1.00pm-3.00pm in St Peter's church hall. LITTLE SISTERS GREENOCK OPEN DAY, SATURDAY 1 MARCH: Families are invited to come and see the Little Sisters Home for the Elderly in Greenock or arrange private visits and tours. The Home receives applications either for an independent living apartment or for a room in the Care Home and can facilitate entry without much delay for those whose needs can no longer be met in family homes. This Catholic environment has a resident Chaplain to provide daily Mass and the Sacraments alongside highly trained nursing and care staff, associates and volunteers to meet the spiritual, physical and social needs of each resident in a family environment (more information see the notice board).

SPRED SPECIAL SECOND COLLECTION - 9TH FEBRUARY 2025: Our Paisley Diocese SPRED offers people with learning disabilities: a personal friend who takes time to share life and faith, spiritual nurture in a small community of faith; and a sense of belonging to a parish community. Twenty-one SPRED groups meet in our church halls and special needs schools, allowing two hundred parishioners to come together in faith and friendship to share and experience God's love. Paisley SPRED now employs two staff members, following a retirement in 2024. In SPRED "I feel that I belong and everyone is my friend". In 2024 (draft) total income for SPRED was £54,610 with £25,298 of this raised from the Special Collection. This was after a large fundraising appeal by friends of SPRED, which increased collection income to £25,298 (up £7,686 on the 2023 figure). In 2024 total expenditure for SPRED was £75,425 resulting in a deficit of £20,815 which was funded from general reserves. In 2024 collection income funded 34% of the total costs.
