ST PETER'S CHURCH REPAIR: Your humble donations are welcome towards the cost of Church repairs starting in the first week of March. The collection box is placed inside the church as you enter and at side door. The recent notification from

the Diocese says that the insurance company won't pay any compensation for any property damage caused by the poor condition of a roof or by blocked gutters. The parish also needs to look into other repairs immediately.

<u>SPRED SPECIAL COLLECTION</u> – 9TH FEBRUARY 2025: Today's special collection is for the SPRED which offers help for people with learning disabilities and accompanies them on their faith journey, in our diocese. Twenty-one SPRED groups meet in our church halls and special needs schools. In 2024 there was a deficit of £20,815 which was funded from general reserves. Change from PAYA Charity to Charities Trust for Online Giving: At the start of the Covid pandemic, the Diocese of Paisley set up online giving with PAYA Charity to allow Parishioners to donate to their Parishes while unable to attend Mass in person.
