'DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME' FOR PRIMARY 4: As in 2024, the Primary 4 children of St Peter's Primary School will have the sacramental preparation called 'Do this in Memory of Me' on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> March, Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> March and Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> March during 10am mass. On 16<sup>th</sup> March we will also celebrate the Family Mass for P4 & P7. The first confession of P4 of St Peter's School is on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup>, and St Fergus on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup>.

<u>DAFFODIL TEA</u>: St Peter's children's liturgy would like to invite all elders in St Peter's and St Fergus' parishes to a Daffodil tea on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> March from 1.00pm-3.00pm in St Peter's church hall. The children will organise and host this event and provide entertainment.

<u>ST PETER'S CHURCH REPAIR</u>: You are welcome to donate towards the cost of Church repair.

100 CLUB IN ST PETER'S: The parish is going to introduce a 100 club, in order to raise funds for ongoing work in the church and chapel house. The cost would be £5 monthly and this amount would be payable on the last Sunday of the month. If we collect 100 names, the prize will be £250 for the winner and £250 for the Church. And if we don't, then the prize will be half of what we have collected. Anyone joining this scheme would be registering for one calendar year. The first number chosen will be the same number for each month. The draw will be made on the first Sunday of every month. The winning number will be drawn each month by any person asked by Fr Thomas at the end of the vigil mass. The winners will be published on the website and parish bulletin. Friends and family members would be welcome to join as happened with Lucky Stars. We hope to start in the last week of March.

LENT CLUSTER MASSES: As in last year, Paisley cluster parishes will have one evening mass throughout the Lent. The days are as follows. On Mondays in St Mary's, on Tuesdays in St Peter's, on Wednesdays in St Mirin's Cathedral and on Thursdays in St Charles. While in St Peter's Adoration and Confession will begin at 6pm followed by mass at 6.30 pm (due to Bible reading at 7pm), in other parishes adoration and confession will be at 6.30pm followed by mass at 7pm. However, on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup>, there is no evening mass in St Mirin's. On Tuesdays St Peter's will not have the morning mass as there is mass in the evening.

Works of Mercy: Three pillars of Lent are\_Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. The Church emphasizes the practice of spiritual and corporal works of mercy throughout the year, but particularly during the season of Lent, as these acts of charity are seen as a way to live out Christian compassion and are strongly connected to the teachings of Jesus.

Spiritual Works of Mercy address emotional and spiritual needs. They are: Instruct the ignorant-Teach those who lack knowledge. Counsel the doubtful- Offer guidance to the uncertain. Admonish the sinner- Encourage repentance gently. Bear wrongs patiently- Endure wrongs without retaliation. Forgive willingly- Let go of grudges. Comfort the afflicted- Support those who are suffering. Pray for the living and the dead-Intercede through prayer.

<u>Corporal Works of Mercy</u> address physical needs: They are: Feed the hungry- Provide food to those in need. Give drink to the thirsty- Offer water to those in need. Clothe the naked- Donate clothes. Shelter the homeless- Offer a place to stay. Visit the imprisoned- Spend time with those in prison. Care for the sick- Attend to those who are ill. Bury the dead- Ensure the deceased are laid to rest.
