TWO FEASTS: Last week the Church celebrated the
feast of two great saints – St Bridget of Sweden and
St James the Apostle. The first had a natural death
while the second suffered martyrdom for his faith in
Jesus. Saint Bridget of Sweden: Bridget was
born in the year 1303. She was the daughter of a
wealthy governor in Sweden. She married a well to
do man and they had eight children. She went on to
serve as the principal lady in waiting to the queen

of Sweden. She had a reputation as a woman of great prayer. After her husband's death, Bridget became a member of the Third Order of St. Francis and devoted herself wholly to a life of prayer and caring for the poor and the sick. Around this time, she sensed Christ calling her to found a new religious order. She founded a monastery for nuns and monks. She journeyed to Rome in 1349 to obtain papal approval for the order, known as the Bridgettines. She never returned to Sweden from Rome. She spent the rest of her life in Italy or on various pilgrimages including one to the Holy Land. She along with Catherine of Sienna, worked hard to get Pope Clement VI to return from Avignon to Rome. She experienced visions of various kinds; some of them were of the passion of Christ. She died in Rome in 1373 and was canonized less than twenty years later. In 1999, Pope John Paul II made her a co-patroness of Europe, alongside Saint Catherine of Sienna and Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. Saint James, the Apostle: James and his brother John, along with Peter and his brother Andrew, were the first to be called by Jesus to follow him. Mother of James and John approached Jesus and asked for them best seats in the kingdom. Jesus asked them, 'Can you drink the cup I am going to drink?' Together, the brothers answered, 'We can'. Within a little over a decade James did drink the cup that Jesus had to drink. However, as Jesus went on to say, the rulers of earthly kingdoms 'lord it over them and their great men make their authority felt', and then very pointedly said to his disciples, 'This is not to happen among you'. As Jesus goes on to say, in the kingdom of God the truly great are those who serve God and others with self-giving love. St Paul in his letter to 2 Corinthians said, he carried with him in his body the death of Jesus. According to the Acts of the Apostles, just over ten years after the death and resurrection of Jesus, King Herod Agrippa 'had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword' (Acts 12:2). He was the first member of the group of the twelve apostles to be put to death for their faith in Jesus. According to an ancient tradition, James' bones were brought from Jerusalem to Compostella in North West Spain, which is why it has been a place of great pilgrimage for centuries. Wherever people serve others in the Spirit of Jesus, the kingdom of God comes to earth. We can be

thankful for all those Christ-like servants who live among us today.

EASY FUNDRAISING FOR ST PETER'S AND ST FERGUS: Easy fundraising is a platform that allows people to raise money for a noble cause, such as a charity/church/school. It is by doing your online shopping. When someone shops through the *easyfundraising website or app*, the retailer donates a percentage of the sale price to the shopper's chosen cause without any additional cost to the shopper. As mentioned, it doesn't cost the buyer any additional burden and the advantage is that it will raise some fund for the parish. Fliers are available at the back of both Churches.
