THE LATERAN BASILICA: Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, called "mother and head of all the churches of the city and the world." In the city of Rome, there are four major basilicas. The first three are Saint Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls, and the Basilica of Saint Mary Major. The fourth is the Lateran Basilica. This Basilica's official title is "Basilica of the Most Holy Saviour

and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran." This is the oldest and most important basilica, the dedication of which is remembered today. Though the pope now lives next to Saint Peter's Basilica, Saint John Lateran is the official cathedral of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, the Bishop of Rome, not the Basilica of St. Peter as so many mistakenly believe. St. John Lateran is unique because it is both a cathedral and a basilica. The Church celebrates the anniversary of the dedication as a cathedral since it is not only the mother church of the Archdiocese of Rome but also the mother church of the entire world. Because the Church/Cathedral bears the title of "Christ our Saviour Cathedral," today's feast is considered a Feast of the Lord which takes precedence over the Sunday liturgy. This feast became a universal celebration in honour of the archbasilica, the ecclesiastical mother church, as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter.

In ancient Rome this was the church where everyone was baptized. It is the oldest church in the West, built after Emperor Constantine's edict, in 313, granted Christians freedom to practice their religion and was consecrated by Pope Sylvester in 324. Only after the 6th century were the names of St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist added.

Today's feast celebrates a mystery that is always relevant: God's desires to have a community that worships him. It also reminds us of the importance of the material buildings in which the community gathers to celebrate the praises of God.

EASY FUNDRAISING FOR ST PETER'S AND ST FERGUS: As Christmas is approaching people will be busy buying things online. Easy fundraising is a platform that allows people to raise money for a noble cause, such as a charity/church/school. It is by doing your online shopping. When someone shops through the *easyfundraising website or app*, the retailer donates a percentage of the sale price to the shopper's chosen cause without any additional cost to the shopper. As mentioned, it doesn't cost the buyer any additional burden and the advantage is that it will raise some fund for the parish.
